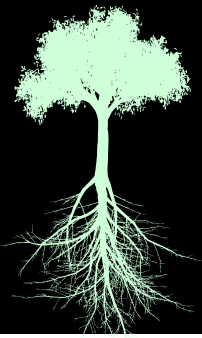

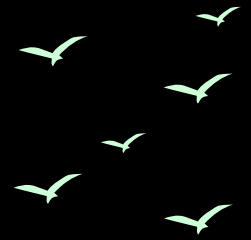

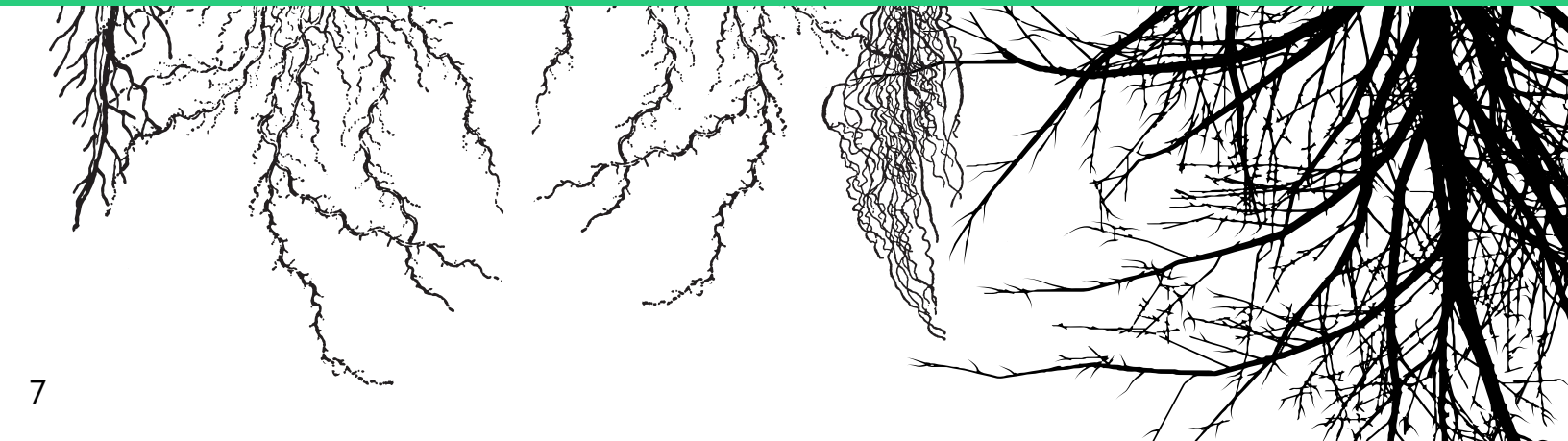

Martin Entz, PhD

Senior Scholar, Department of Plant Science, University of Manitoba

Martin Entz received his PhD from the University of Saskatchewan and then spent over 30 years as professor at the University of Manitoba. His goal is to discover new ways of farming ecologically, and to empower farmers with knowledge and other tools required to design sustainable farming systems adapted to where they live.

Martin has worked on 4 continents and currently leads research East Africa. He teaches courses in organic agriculture and regularly gets students involved in the research. In 1992, he started the Glenlea Long-Term Rotation Study - Canada's oldest organic vs conventional farming systems experiment. Since 2023, he has held the Jarislowsky Chair in Natural Systems Agriculture for Climate Solutions.

Session 1 - Keynote

March 26: Building on 35 years of organic research and education: The future of organics



Andrew Hammermeister, PhD, P.Ag

Associate Professor and Director of the Organic Agriculture Centre of Canada, Dalhousie University

Dr. Andy Hammermeister has worked with the Organic Agriculture Centre of Canada (Dalhousie University) for over 20 years to support the growth of organic agriculture. He is the Science Director for Canada's national Organic Science Cluster, has been a voting member of the National Organic Standards Technical Committee, Board Member of Organic Nova Scotia, and of course he teaches organic courses and conducts organic research. Andy has brought the international voice and principles of the organic movement to his work and advocacy. Although he lives in Nova Scotia, Andy's roots and heart remain in Saskatchewan and prairie agriculture.

Session 2

March 26: Into the future: applying novel technologies to organic farming



Garry Richards

Garry Richards, Rancher, Bangor, Saskatchewan

Garry and his wife Lynn returned to Garry's family's grain farm in 2000. They became a mixed farm in 2002, began using Holistic Management in 2003, and farmed with a focus on Regenerative Agriculture starting in 2007. In 2024, they stopped grain farming and became a ranch, always with an eye on healthier people and relationships, healthier profits, and a healthier ecosystem. Their journey includes raising children, a farm succession, raising cattle, AMP grazing, conventional grain production, cover cropping, organic grain farming, and intercropping.

Session 3

March 26: Livestock and our road to regeneration



John Stavrinides, PhD

Professor, Biology Department Head, University of Regina

John received his PhD from the University of Toronto in 2007, and is currently a Professor of microbiology in the Department of Biology at the University of Regina. His current research focuses on the use of microbes to address challenges in agriculture and human health. John is presently supported by over \$850,000 in grants, and has supervised 18 graduate student and 139 undergraduate student research projects. He enjoys long, barefoot walks in organic fields that are free of Canada thistle.

Elizabeth Bekolay, BSc

Executive Director, One School One Farm Shelterbelt Project

Elizabeth Bekolay is a biologist, author, and the Executive Director of the One School One Farm Shelterbelt Project, a community-led initiative that reconnects people with the land through relationship building and ecological immersion. Her work bridges science, education, and community action to support biodiversity, climate resilience, and regenerative prairie landscapes.

Henry Wilson, PhD, BSc

Research Scientist, AAFC, Brandon Research and Development Centre, Manitoba

Dr. Wilson grew up on a mixed organic farm near Kenton, Manitoba. His education took him on a path from Brandon University (B.Sc.) to Trent University (Ph.D.) to Yale University (postdoctoral fellow) before starting his current position as a Research Scientist at the Brandon Research and Development Centre with Agriculture and Agri-food Canada where he has been employed for the past 15 years. His research is focused on finding ways to produce food effectively while also maintaining healthy rural soils, ecosystems, and good water quality.

Sarah Preston

Sarah Preston is the Prairie Regional Program Manager with The Bauta Family Initiative on Canadian Seed Security. A lifelong plant nerd, her path has included farm apprenticeships, running a CSA market garden and small apiary, and several years of coordinating sustainable agriculture programs across the Prairies. Based near Edmonton, AB, Sarah brings experience in regional food systems, organic and regenerative practices, and farmer-focused programming, along with a background in food security, permaculture design, and community engagement. She's excited to support Prairie farmers in all things seeds.

March 27: From field to policy: Advancing farmer-led organic seed policy solutions



Aabir Dey

Director, Canadian Field Program, The Bauta Family Initiative on Canadian Seed Security

Aabir developed his passion for seeds while he was completing his Sustainable Farming Certificate at Everdale, a teaching farm in Hillsburgh, Ontario, and supporting research trials for Seeds of Diversity's collection of over 3,000 different Canadian seed varieties. After completing a Master of Environmental Studies at York University, researching organic seed systems in Ontario, Aabir joined the The Bauta Family Initiative on Canadian Seed Security, as Regional Program Coordinator

for Ontario. Aabir has co-authored publications on Canada's seed system including the Canadian Organic Seed Sector Environmental Scan, the Discussion Paper on Seed Policy in Canada, and Canadian Organic and Ecological Plant Breeding Priorities for Vegetable Crops. He has been instrumental in shaping and leading the training, research, and policy programs developed for The Bauta Family Seed Initiative. Aabir loves working in the field with seed producers and farmers all over Canada, and is thrilled to continue to steward The Bauta Family Seed Initiative at a national level into the future.

Andy Wagman

Organic Producer, Medicine Hat, Alberta

Andy, an ROC-certified farmer near Medicine Hat, has been producing organically since the 1990s. His farm includes irrigation, dryland, grazing, intercropping, cover crops, and on-farm grain separation. He raises cattle year-round using low-intervention methods, maintains pollinator habitats, and has experience using a weed zapper for invasive plant control.

Scott Beaton

Organic Producer, Jackfish Creek Farm, Stonewall, Manitoba

Scott Beaton runs a first generation farm near Stonewall; Between the Big Lakes in MB with his wife Jenny and 2 kids. Their farm is a section of certified organic grains coupled with a grass finished cow calf direct to consumer beef operation. Scott is enthusiastic about maintaining some conservation areas, as part of the farm, and uses the beef herd to manage the farmland, encouraging use of cover crops, perennials in rotation, and plants to improve soil with the goal of leaving the farm better for the next generation. He got an agronomy degree from the University of MB, and thinks of the farm as an agri-ecosystem with significant contributions from "less managed areas".

Yi Zeng

Senior Director, Asia and Global Commodities, Saskatchewan Trade & Export Partnership (STEP)

Yi Zeng was born and raised in the South of China. With ten years of experience in banking and human resource management in China, Yi moved to Saskatchewan in 2003 to further pursue his education. Two years later, he attained his Masters degree in Human Resource Management from the University of Regina. In October 2009, Yi joined Saskatchewan Trade and Export Partnership (STEP) started from a Trade Specialist position, focusing on the Asia and Africa markets. Since 2013, Yi has held responsibilities as director to assist Saskatchewan exporters on developing Asia markets including China, Japan, Mongolia, South Korea, and ASEAN regions. Yi is a Certified International Trade Professional (CITP) in Canada and currently serves as Senior Director, Asia and Global Commodities, at STEP, which is the official trade promotional organization for the Province of Saskatchewan.

Rob Beattie farms near Kyle, Saskatchewan, and brings more than 30 years of experience as a contract engineer and farmer, along with 25 years in the telecommunications industry. In 2020, he founded the Carbon Farm Group, a network of seven farms—including one organic operation—collectively managing over 25,000 acres using regenerative and organic practices.

Joe Buttigieg is the owner and operator of Fenek Farms, a diversified livestock and agritourism farm near Regina, Saskatchewan. Fenek Farms blends sheep, cattle, poultry, and alpacas with hands-on public programming such as farm tours, educational workshops, farm camps, and mobile petting zoos. Joe is also a professor at the University of Regina (Biology/Neurosciences), bringing a strong education and mentorship focus to his farming work. His interests include agritourism, sustainable farm diversification, and connecting the public with real farm life.

Owner/Operator, Alive Sky Lodge, Rosetown

Darryl and April Anderson grew up on family farms in Saskatchewan and dated in high school. 25 years later, Darryl was still farming and April had a career in law enforcement still holding a love for farming and a rural lifestyle. Together they are focused on Agritourism with unique rural accommodations near Rosetown, SK. Alive Sky Lodge hosts international guests, neighbours, pets and small livestock. 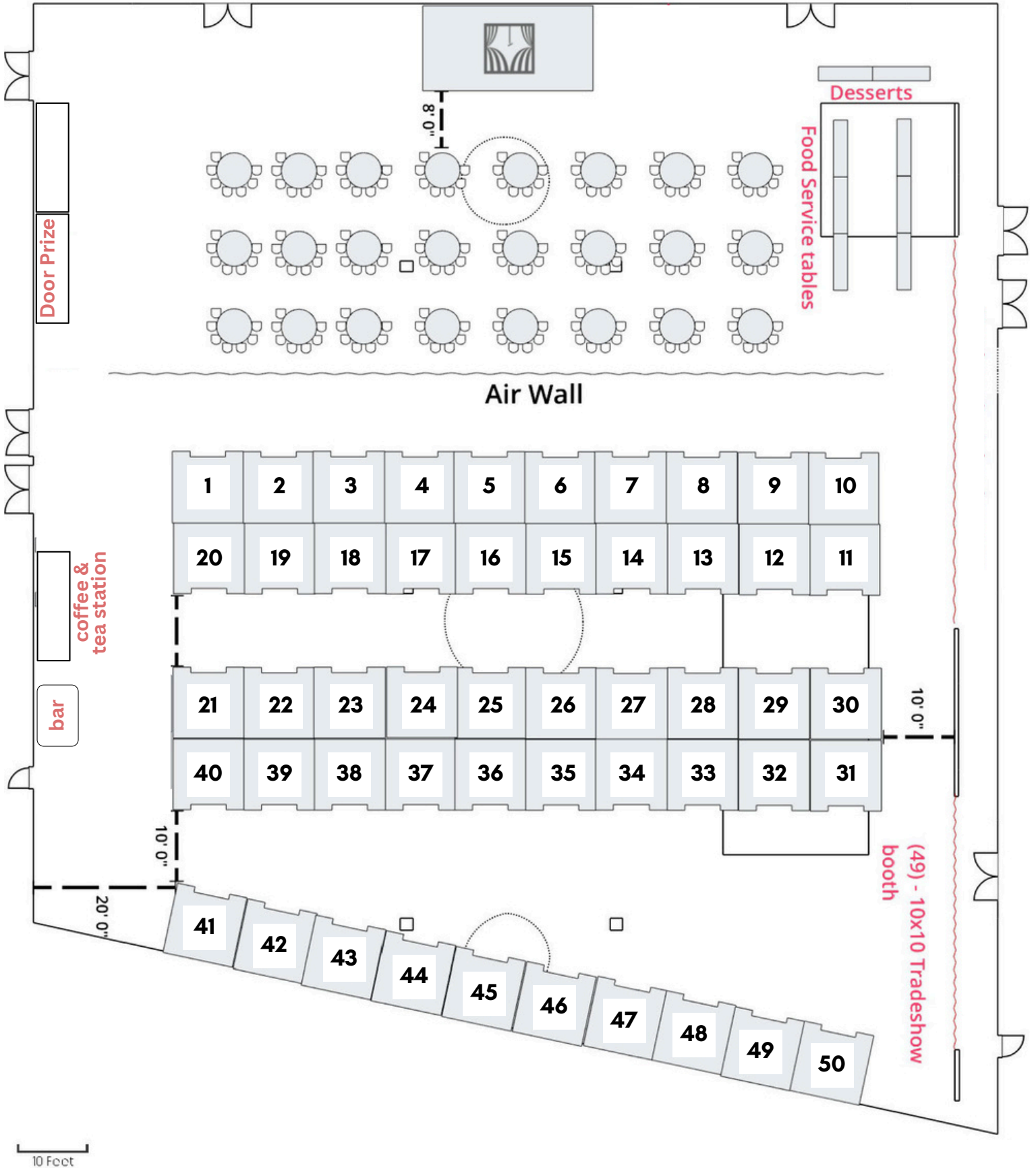

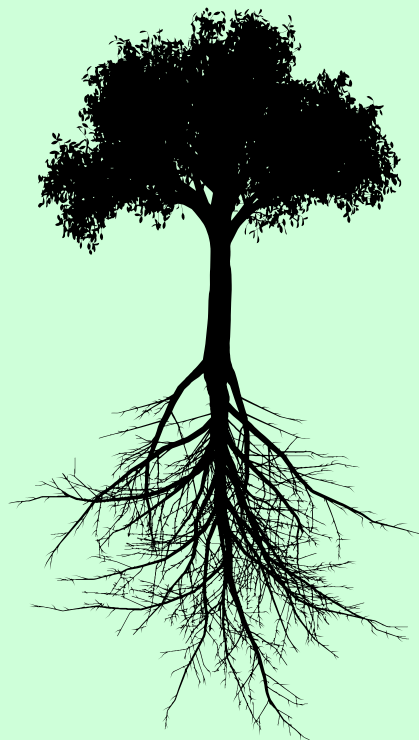

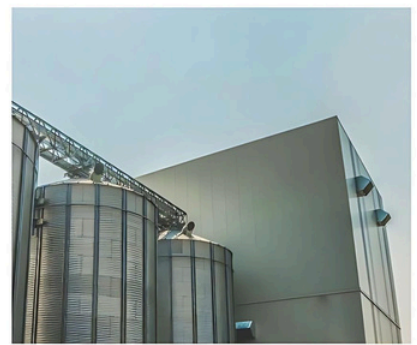
