STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

SaskOrganics' strategic plan 2018–2023 identified the overarching priority of building capacity, in particular a stable financial foundation, in order to deliver the following six strategic priorities:

- Promote Research that Reflects Producers Needs
- Extension Services & Knowledge Transfer
- Support New and Transitioning Farmers
- Maintain Organic Integrity
- Value Added Processing
- Understand & Expand Markets

The strategic priorities provide a framework for SaskOrganics' work, advocacy, education program and communications. Here are the 2021 highlights:

Research that Reflects Producers' Needs

Agriculture Development Fund (ADF)

SaskOrganics was an industry partner in the 2021 funding round for the ADF. Members of our Education and Research committee formed a sub-committee to evaluate the letters of intent (LOI) to determine which projects would benefit organic farmers.

In 2021, the ADF received 294 LOIs. Of the 294 LOIs, the sub-committee asked to review 24. Of the 24 reviewed, SaskOrganics wrote letters of support for 9. 55 projects were funded in total – 3 of which were projects that SaskOrganics wrote letters of support for.

ADOPT Grant

SaskOrganics has partnered with the Sask Forage Seed Development Commission on an Intermediate Wheat Grass (IWG) ADOPT project. It is a two-year project to evaluate the potential of Intermediate Wheat Grass (Thinopyrum intermedium) for food and feed when grown in northeast Saskatchewan under organic and conventional cropping systems. Due to the drought conditions in 2021 the project has been extended for another year (2023).

Organic Science Cluster 4

The Organic Science Cluster 4 LOI process required researchers to identify "Collaborating Extension Specialists or Industry Professionals". SaskOrganics was approached and agreed to be included in this capacity for five LOIs. If funded, the research would make a significant contribution to organic agronomy.

AAFC - Agriculture Climate Solutions Living Labs Initiative Application

SaskOrganics provided a letter of support for the Bridge to Land Water Sky proposal. The project has a number of goals including improving land management strategies to mitigate GHG emissions, promote carbon sequestration, increase food security and food sovereignty in indigenous and non-indigenous communities, and protect biodiversity.

Support New & Transitioning Farmers

SaskOrganics staff continue to provide transition and organic production resources to farmers who get in touch that are interested in learning more about going organic.

In 2021, we started to develop a video series, modelled after our in-person transition to organic workshops. The online course will provide information that will help farmers navigate transitioning to organic agriculture. The topics will include an overview of the Canada Organic Standard, annual requirements & record keeping, agronomic considerations, marketing, certification, and producer testimonials. These resources will be available free of charge on our YouTube channel in mid-2022.

Maintain Organic Integrity

In 2021, SaskOrganics and the OAPF committee were activiely engaged in two important consultations by Health Canada and the CFIA regarding proposed changes to regulatory guidance for gene edited food and seeds. If approved, the proposed guidance would remove government oversight of many new genetically modified organisms (GMOs) produced through the new genetic engineering techniques of genome editing (also called gene editing) that contain no foreign DNA. (Crops produced using gene editing are prohibited under the Canada Organic Standard). If the proposed changes are implemented, unregulated GMOs would be on the market without government approval and no mandatory notification to government, farmers, or the public. We worked with CBAN and other stakeholders to bring this issue to the attention of producers and the public to help ensure the concerns of the organic sector were brought to the attention of Health Canada and the CFIA.

SaskOrganics was also actively engaged in a consultation by Health Canada: Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2021-10, Glyphosate. We collaborated with COTA, Safe Food Matters and Prevent Cancer Now to host a webinar to inform and educate citizens and encourage submissions to the consultation. After extending the consultation period due to the "level of interest and number of comments received to date, in addition to delays related to the COVID-19 pandemic", the Government of Canada announced they would pause the decision on Glyphosate as it strengthens the capacity and transparency of the review process for pesticides. They also committed to consulting on specific provisions of the Pest Control Products Act (2002) to increase transparency, and committed \$50 million over three years to strengthen regulatory oversight and to support work accelerating the research, development and adoption of alternative pest management solutions.

Value-Added Processing

SaskOrganics curated our second annual Abundance Box in 2021. We were pleased to feature and promote 10 great local companies that are processing food and non-food items using organic ingredients. We increased the number of boxes to 250, up from 146 in 2020. We were absolutely thrilled with the support and sold out for another year! A big thank you to everyone that purchased a box (or boxes) for yourself or someone you know, to the companies that purchased boxes to share with staff and clients, and to all our contributing companies. This year's boxes travelled not only to locations in Saskatchewan, but as far as Texas, Salt Spring Island, Nova Scotia and everywhere in between! The Abundance Box is proving to be an effective vehicle to highlight and promote value-added processors in the province, and promote the organic sector in Saskatchewan locally and beyond.



Understand and Expand Markets

In 2021, SaskOrganics held an Organic Grain Markets Webinar in Spring and Fall. Due to their popularity and value, they have become a regular part of our education program. They continue to be the most well attended webinars. In the Fall webinar, 13 grain buyers participated and there were over 110 attendees.

SaskOrganics made presentations promoting the organic sector in Saskatchewan at two STEP Virtual Conferences – Healthy Ingredients Showcase & the 9th Annual Saskatchewan Asia Conference. We also had a booth at the Canada Farm Show Online (Farm Progress Show).

SaskOrganics collaborated with the Canada Organic Trade Association to publish the 2022 State of Organics Report that documents how the federal, provincial and territorial governments are supporting the growth and development of the organic sector.



COMMUNICATIONS

Abundance Magazine

In 2021, Abundance Magazine celebrated its fifth anniversary! It has been, and continues to be, a pleasure to put together each issue featuring the abundance of good stories about the organic sector in Saskatchewan! Each issue has a number of regular features – *Innovate* (featuring a Saskatchewan certified organic producer or processor), *Nourish* (a farm-to-table theme that features Saskatchewan chefs who are doing just that, with a focus on organic & local ingredients), *Sustain* (best agronomic practices), upcoming industry events and more.

The magazine is direct-mailed to over 1200 contacts around the province (and beyond!), and is made possible by the support of our advertisers and the talented team at Blossom Communications.





Our monthly digital newsletter is published on the third Friday of each month, and is our most effective communication tool to promote events, the latest news relevant to the sector, important updates, and opportunities to participate in consultations and research projects. In between monthly newsletters, we send out individual campaigns as reminders for upcoming events, items that require actions with time sensitive deadlines, etc. We do our best to strike a balance between getting important news and information to our members and not contributing to 'in-box overload'! Our classified ads took off in 2021, with at least one new classified ad in each month's newsletter.

Audience: 1200 contacts. 52% of our audience are highly engaged and regularly open emails.

Outstanding Organic Farmer Award Recipient 2021

An outstanding farmer in our eyes is one who is making an outstanding contribution to the organic sector here in Saskatchewan. Thank you to North West Saskatchewan Organic Producer Group for providing the inspiration to establish an award recognizing and promoting innovation in the organic sector. SaskOrganics is proud to present this award to Cody Straza and Allison Squires of Upland Organics.

Cody and Allison farm near Wood Mountain, Saskatchewan. Upland Organics uses a drone to monitor weed infestations and regularly tests to monitor any changes in their soils, with the primary focus on improving the health and diversity of the soil biology. As a result of the all-too-familiar challenge of marketing grains and losing substantial dockage with minimal compensation, they built a grain cleaning operation that has served them and other local organic growers meet export standards, creating an opportunity to deal directly with international buyers. Both Cody and Allison are active volunteers in their local community and serve on a number of provincial, national and international boards. They are advocates for the need to advance agronomic practices within organic production and supportive of the SaskOrganics' work in advancing that goal. Congratulations Cody and Allison!




